Plastic bottles were the third most common type of litter found along the Hudson in 2018. New York's existing bottle deposit program covers a limited number of carbonated beverages and wine coolers with a 65% bottle return rate. Compare that to states without bottle deposit programs that report an average 24% recycling rate in traditional curbside programs. Lessons from other states with more expansive bottle deposit programs such as Maine, report an 84% redemption rate, showing that expanding the bottle bill to include more types of beverage bottles will increase recycling rates and reduce the number that end up polluting our waterways. DEC estimates New York's existing bottle bill has decreased beverage container litter by 70% for bottles currently covered. **I urge you to support Assembly bill A.5028-A, which would expand New York State's bottle deposit program to include non-carbonated beverages as well as wine and liquor glass bottles.**
